After you have dropped your child(ren) off at school, you are invited to come along for a coffee and hear about how to keep children safe on the internet. Alternatively there is an evening session on the same day.

The actual session lasts an hour, followed by an opportunity to stay and ask questions afterwards.

Each session will include:

- Cyberbullying
- Grooming
- Inappropriate and misleading websites
- What you can do to keep your child(ren) safe
- Where to go for more information
- (Most importantly) what to do if the worst comes to the worst

The session is not all 'doom and gloom', it is about understanding the possible dangers and how to keep everyone safe.

Rob Ellis, an e-learning specialist from the Isle of Wight, will run the sessions. Rob has more than 30 years' experience as a teacher and senior leader in schools. More recently he has worked as a Local Education Officer. As a ThinkUKnow CEOP Ambassador, Rob has delivered training to colleagues, school staff and governors, parents and approximately 4,500 young people.
